BILLY M. BUSBY, Chief of Police, West Point Police Department, West Point, Mississippi, who is aware of the identity of the interviewing Agent, furnished the following information:

BUSBY-stated that at approximately 3:00 a.m. during the morning of January 26, 1970, the West Fire Department received a fire alarm to the Clay County Community Development Center, which is located on Cottrell Street in West Point, Mississippi. BUSBY stated that the Fire Department immediately responded to the alarm and upon arriving at the scene of the fire discovered that the building was in flames and that the fire appeared to be mostly confined to the second story area of the building. BUSBY stated that the fire was controlled approximately one-half hour later and that the building was gutted on the inside.
