DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Yauch-Ragar House is a one-story structure constructed in 1907. The brick house displays characteristics of neo-classicism in its use of Tuscan columns on the facade.

The Yauch-Ragar House is basically rectangular in shape and is covered by a hipped roof of pressed tin with gabled bays. The facade features a gabled projection with a small brick arched window in the gable end and a large brick arched window in the center. A flat-roofed porch graces the north half of the facade and turns onto the north elevation. This porch is supported by Tuscan columns set into brick bases. Extending from the roofline on the facade is a gabled dormer with patterned woodwork in the gable end. A slender brick chimney rises from the peak of the hipped roof. The entry features an intricately carved door with beveled glass flanked by matching carved sidelights and is topped by a three sectioned transom.

The south elevation features a three-sided bay topped by a gabled roof with patterned woodwork in its gable end. Windows on the south elevation, as on the entire house, are brick arched. The north elevation also features a gable-roofed three-sided bay. The width of the east elevation is spanned by an enclosed porch.

The interiors of the house feature original woodwork with classical detailing. Paneled sliding doors between the front parlors are still operable.

Resting on its original site, the Yauch-Ragar House is presently being utilized as a law office. The owner is in the process of maintaining the good condition of the house and is restoring detailing throughout the structure.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Yauch - Ragar House, 625 State Street, Pine Bluff, Arkansas.

In the early 1900s, when the majority of the small homes in Pine Bluff were of frame construction, William B. Yauch built a solid brick house at 625 State Street. Architecturally the house followed the styles of the day with its ornamental metal roof, Tuscan columns on brick bases supporting the porch roof and polygon-shaped bay window on the south side. George B. Yauch, William's brother, built a house of similar style at 1002 East Second Avenue, Pine Bluff. The Yauch houses were built from solid brick because the brothers were involved in the Y.O.C. Brick Company. According to Jefferson County records, the Y.O.C. Brick Company was incorporated on March 6, 1906 with George B. Yauch as president and M. L. Case, J. W. O'Neal and William B. Yauch as directors. The company was organized with a capitalization of \$25,000 with \$15,000 paid in and the stock was composed of 1,000 shares with a par value of \$25 per share. George B. Yauch owned 100 shares; William B. Yauch, 100 shares; Case, 200 shares; and O'Neal, 200 shares.¹ The plant's property extended from Hazel Street west to include what is now Jean's Addition to Pine Bluff, back of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff. The factory could make 18,000 bricks per day and employed 25 men.²

George Yauch came to Pine Bluff about 1898 or 1899 and his two brothers, William and Chris came about 1900. Chris started the Yauch Steam Bakery at 223 Main Street and George and William became locomotive engineers for the Cotton Belt Railroad.³

William B. Yauch was born in Sebringville, Ontario, Canada, on December 19, 1873.⁴ He married Ernestine Baer in 1905. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ferdinand Baer of Little Rock and was born February 22, 1876. They were the parents of one son, William B. Yauch, Jr. who lives in Hot Springs.

Yauch bought a portion of Lot 1, Block 2 of Henry Harding's Addition to Pine Bluff from Annie M. Noel on January 2, 1907.⁵ His brother, Chris, had built a frame home at 627 State previously, During 1907 William Yauch built the solid brick house with Y.O.C. brick. At the time he was vice president of Y.O.C. Brick Company.⁶ The residence was the family home until about 1960 when Mrs. Yauch became ill and they moved to Hot

Springs. Mrs. Yauch died January 24, 1962 in a Hot Springs hospital at the age of 85.⁷ Mr. Yauch died at the age of 95 on October 28, 1969, in Hot Springs.⁸ Both are buried in Graceland Cemetery at Pine Bluff.

Thurman Ragar, Jr., bought the Yauch home on August 1, 1974, and converted it into a law office. He became interested in the residence's past and has attempted to restore it to its original condition. Through his efforts, Pine Bluff will have an example of the early 1900s architecture preserved for future generations.

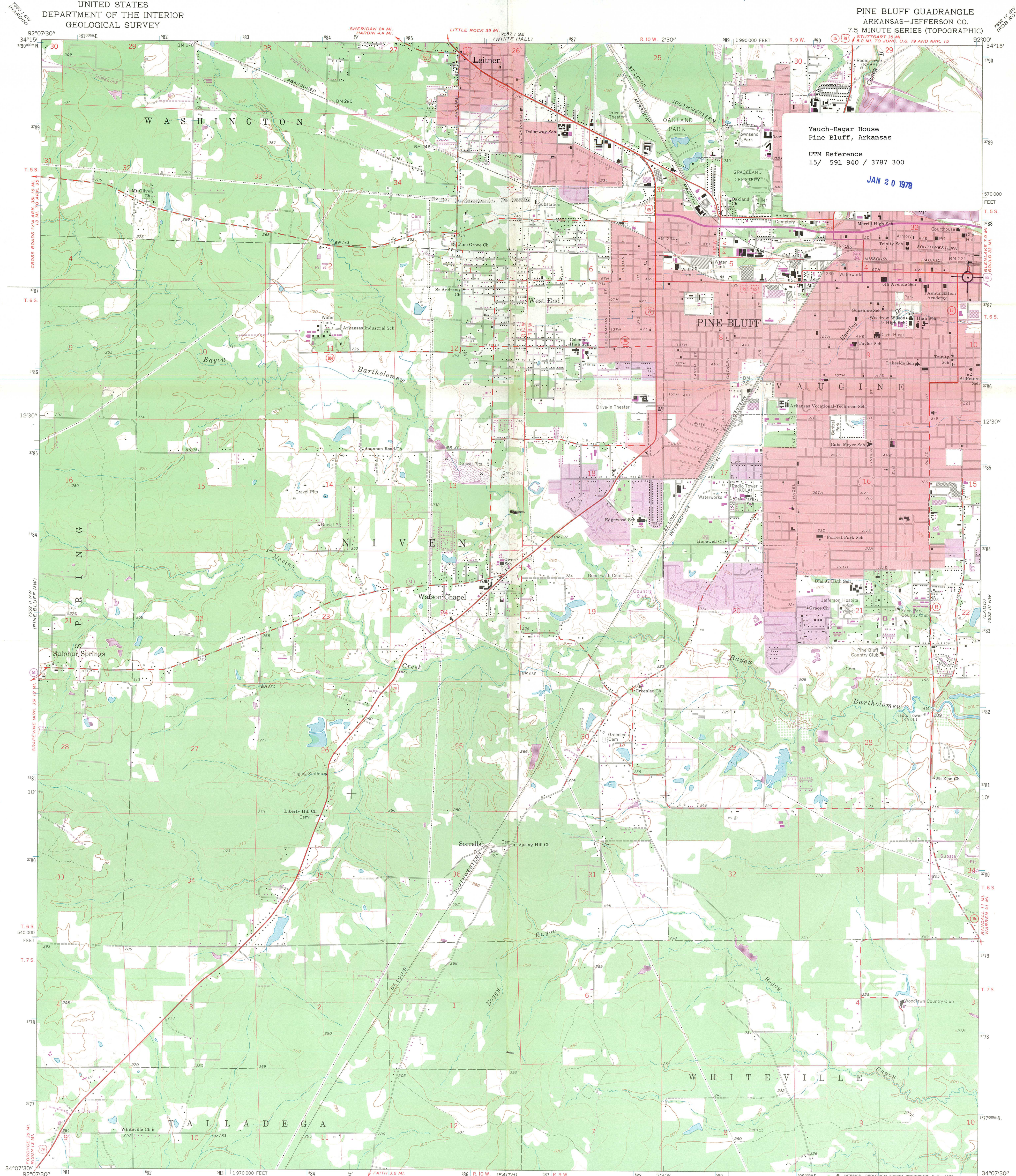

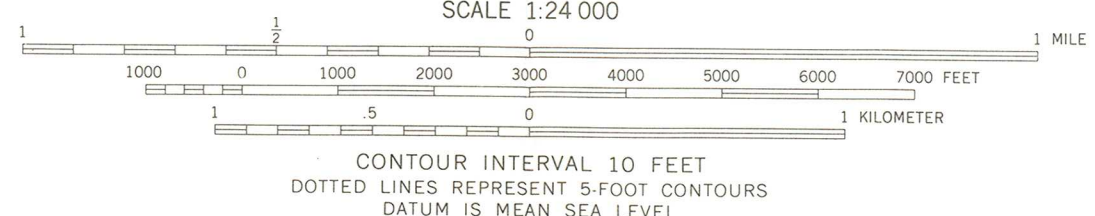
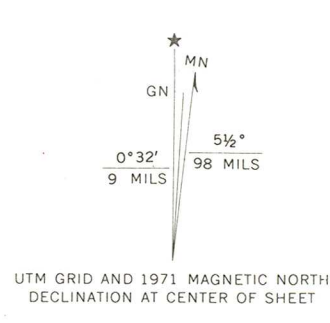

NEED ACREAGE. LESS THAN ONE (1).

NEED VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION. Since is less than one acre, told her we would not require it this time - BUT would encourage them to give us VBDS in future.
