The Morris Institute Dairy Barn is a two-story, wood frame agricultural building. Its plan is unusual, as its central drive is intersected toward the northern end of the barn by a perpendicular drive that connects to more stalls in the shed roof section to the east. Furthermore, the stalls to the west of the central drive are separated from it by a feeding walkway. Toward the northern elevation, these stalls project beyond the walls to the south, creating a lower, shed roof section. The corrugated metal walls are supported by a continuous cast concrete foundation and covered with a metal gable roof and three conical metal vents with circular rain covers.

The southern elevation is accessed via a central vehicular entry with two hay chutes directly above. The entry to the east, into the stall area under the shed roof, has been covered over with tin. The western elevation is lighted with four rectangular wood windows in the projecting section to the north and two more identical windows in the wall to the south. The elevation is accessed via a single entrance in the northern section and two more in the southern section. The northern elevation is accessed through a central double-leaf door leading into the central runway and a smaller, single-leaf door to the west. The double-leaf door originally leading into the eastern stalls has been covered over with tin. The eastern elevation is blank.
