DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Three-story mansard roof Victorian residence designed by St. Louis architect George I. Barnett, situated on a bluff overlooking a wide bend in the Missouri River. Brick and stone construction, well finished with mouldings, quoins, and cresting. Red granite columns donated by Governor B. Gratz Brown (1871-1873), first governor to occupy the Mansion. Columns were quarried from his property in Iron County, Missouri. Grounds are enclosed by ornamental iron fence.

First floor includes large entrance hall, reception parlors, library and dining room. Second floor contains large hallway, six bedrooms and four baths. Third floor has four bedrooms, two baths, billiard room, and the ballroom, which extends the full length of Mansion from north to south. Winding stairway in central hallway has ornate railing and newel post and connects the three floors.

Carriage porch and entrance on south added, 1900-1904. Interior remodeled and modernized, 1938, 1956, and 1960.

Building presently under repair. When repair work is completed, building will be in excellent condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

SEE INSTRUCTIONS

The primary significance of the Governor's Mansion derives from building's use as the official residence of Missouri's governors, 1871 to present. Secondary significance of Mansion rests in the fact that it is an outstanding example of a three-story mansard roof Victorian residence and was designed by a notable St. Louis architect, George I. Barnett. Mansion faces the Cole County Historical Society Building located at 109 Madison Street. The latter building is included in a row of nineteenth century urban houses which enhance the setting of the Mansion by sustaining the period homogeneity of the neighborhood.

In April, 1871, Governor B. Gratz Brown obtained a state appropriation of \$50,000 for the construction of a new executive mansion. The Mansion replaced an earlier executive residence located slightly to the south of it. The old executive mansion was razed soon after completion of the present structure.

A marker, erected in 1941 by the Daughters of the American Colonists, commemorates the site of the first Capitol and Governor's Mansion in the City of Jefferson.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Missouri Governor's Mansion is a three-story, red brick, mansard-roofed residence in the Second Empire style. It was designed by St. Louis architect George Ingham Barnett and was completed in December, 1871, by Jefferson City builder Gottlieb Martin.

The house, facing southeast, is situated on a bluff overlooking the Missouri River to the northeast and east.

The exterior brick walls have white stone quoins and foundations below the water table. An ornamental iron cresting trims the roof.

The red granite columns featured on the front porch were donated by Governor B. Gratz Brown (1871-1873), first governor to occupy the Mansion. The columns were quarried from his property in Iron County, Missouri. An ornamental iron fence surrounds the yard.

The first floor has a large entrance hall, double reception parlors, library, dining room, sun porch, butler's pantry, and kitchen. The first-story ceilings are 19 feet high. The second floor is traditionally the private living quarters of the Governor and his family. It includes seven rooms and three bathrooms. The third floor, also used by first families, consists of a ballroom running the width of the house and four bedrooms.

The grand, "U"-plan stairway is free flowing. It has a hand-carved, walnut bannister and deep, rich moldings.

Furnishings include a series of oil portraits of 19 First Ladies, and antiques of the Empire and Victorian periods. Eight of the nine fireplaces in the Mansion are the original pale grey marble. The fireplace in the entrance hall was replaced after a fire during the administration of Governor Joseph A. Folk (1905-1909) with dark verde marble and a hand-carved, walnut mantelpiece featuring an adaptation of the Missouri State Crest in the center.

The hand-carved, walnut entrance doors, each weighing approximately 2000 pounds, are original and hang on hinges dated 1869.

The building is little altered from its original design. Portions of the interior have been remodeled and modernized in 1938, 1956, 1960s, and 1970s. A kitchen wing was added during the administration of Governor Lloyd C. Stark (1937-1941). A carriage porch and south entrance were added 1900-1904. The building is presently in excellent condition. The brick exterior walls have recently been restored to their original red color after having been painted white for many years. Interior window shutters which had been folded and nailed on to the recesses have been restored to their original function.

Since the spring of 1973, Missouri's Executive Mansion has been open for public tours for the first time in its history. Volunteers guide visitors through the first floor rooms each Tuesday and Thursday at 10 and 11 a.m. and 1 p.m.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The primary significance of the Governor's Mansion derives from the building's use as the official residence of Missouri's governors, 1871 to present. Secondary significance rests in the fact that it is an outstanding example of a Second Empire-style Missouri residence designed by the notable St. Louis architect, George I. Barnett.

The Mansion faces the Cole County Historical Society Building, located at 109 Madison Street, to the southeast. The latter building is included in a row of 1870s urban houses which enhances the setting of the Mansion by sustaining the period homogeneity of the neighborhood.

In April, 1871,<sup>1</sup> Governor B. Gratz Brown obtained a state appropriation of \$50,000 for the construction of a new executive mansion. The Mansion replaced an earlier executive residence located slightly to the south of it. The old mansion was razed soon after completion of the present structure. The final cost of the present building, including some of the furnishings, was \$74,960.<sup>2</sup>

ARCHITECT: George Ingham Barnett was born in Nottingham, England, in 1815. His education and formal architectural training, under Sir Thomas Hine, were completed in London. He came to America in 1839 and settled in St. Louis where he pursued an architectural practice for fifty years. St. Louis was at one time replete with examples of his work. However, numerous examples have been destroyed. Barnett died at St. Louis in 1898. He was one of the first professionally trained architects to have an extensive practice in the State of Missouri, and he is generally considered to be one of Missouri's finest nineteenth-century architects.<sup>3</sup>

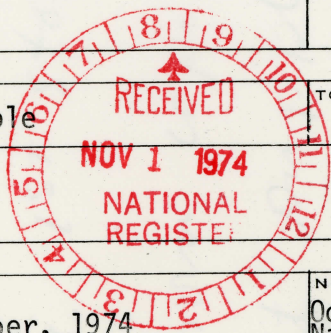

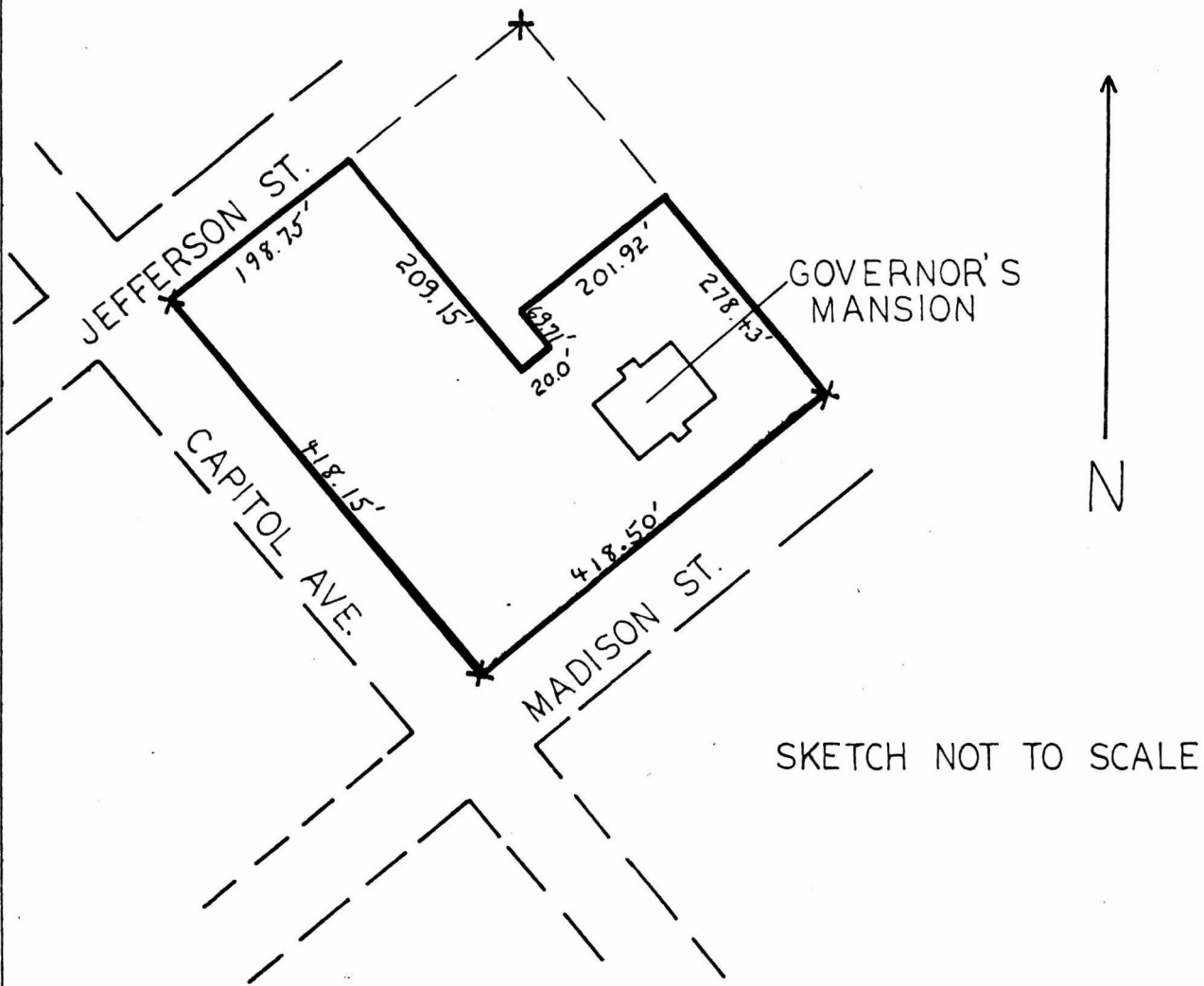
