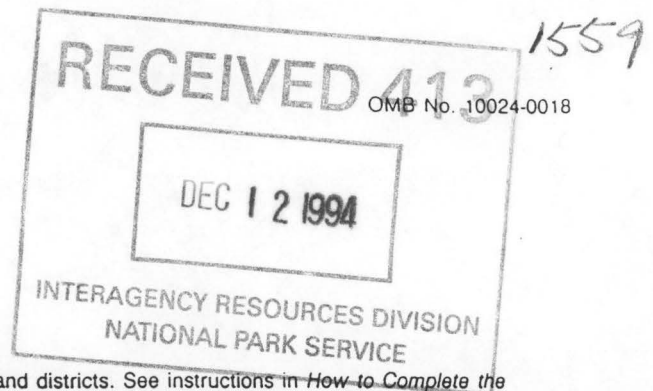

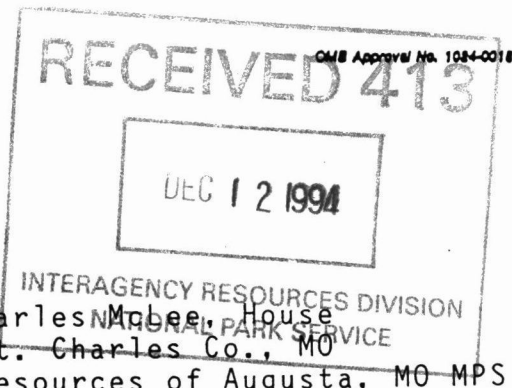

Located at 5517 High street in Augusta, Missouri, the Charles McLee Farris House is a ca.1850 1 1/2 story frame house (Property Type: Vernacular Residence). Alterations to the building have not substantially detracted from its overall integrity of design and materials.

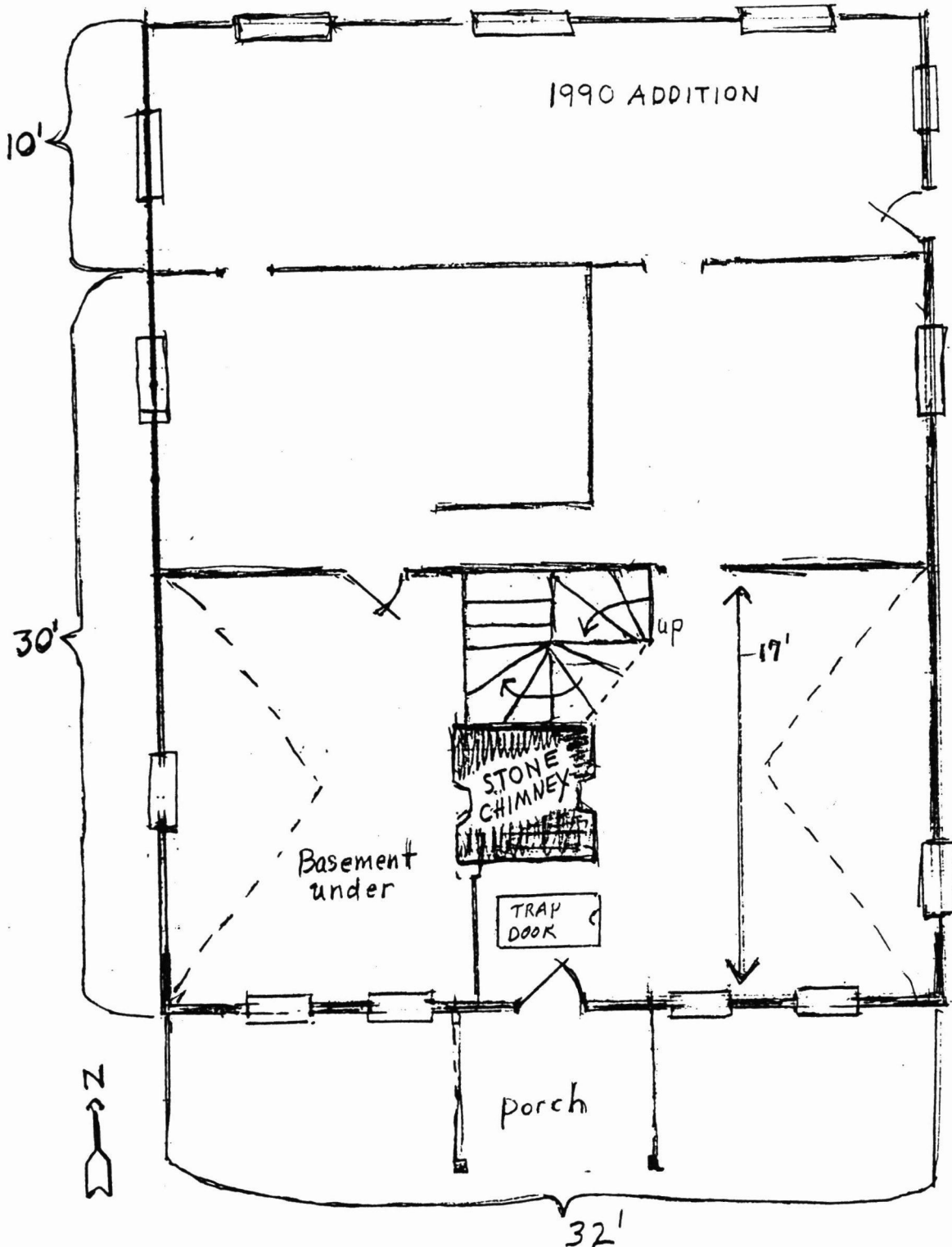
Resting on a stone foundation, the house measures approximately 32 feet wide (east-west) by 30 feet deep, extended north 10 feet with a 1990 addition. The saddlebag plan features a large central stone chimney with hearths opening to both rooms on the first floor and to both of the loft rooms above which are accessed by a turned stair on the north side of the chimney. A flue hole is cut into the wall of the chimney in the east first floor room; this room also features an exposed timber ceiling, and a trap door leading to a basement room with log joists on the west side. A partially exposed north wall in the east room indicates that the house is half-timbered construction (with brick nogging) which has been weatherboarded. The two front rooms (covered with a side-gabled roof) open to a one-story shed-roof section which may be original or an early addition. The five-bay primary facade features a center entry with side-lights and transom now boarded over, and a small wood porch with gabled roof supported by slender polygonal chamfered posts. A comparison of Photo #1 with a historic view, Photo #4, shows only minor alteration such as the removal of the center porch posts, removal of shutters, and the replacement of what were probably original wood steps with the present concrete steps.

The Charles McLee Farris House is eligible for listing in the National Register under Criterion C and is significant in the following area: ARCHITECTURE: Built ca. 1850, the house is a well-preserved, noteworthy example of Property Type: Vernacular Residence, exhibiting the simplicity of plan and design characteristic of the type, but distinguished by a massive stone internal chimney and hearths; known to exist in only one other area property. See Historic Context, "German American Culture in Augusta, 1833-1944" and subtheme, "Architecture ca.1836-1943".

In October, 1851, Charles McLee Farris, 45, a native of Virginia, purchased lots 1 and 2 (Block 4) from town founder Leonard Harold. The purchase price of \$157.62 is somewhat puzzling as lots were selling for about \$25 each at that time, suggesting that the parcel may have included a small building. In fact, it appears that Farris was already living near (or possibly in) this house in 1850 judging by the location of his immediate neighbors as listed in the census. A deed of 1851 (Book Z, page 17) reveals that Farris owned all of Block 4, which he placed in trust for the benefit of his wife and children. A Justice of the Peace in the 1850 census, Farris came to St. Charles County around 1832 and was engaged as a schoolteacher according to the History of St. Charles County. He had purchased rural property not far from Augusta as early as January 1832, and in the 1840 census was engaged in agriculture with the help of four slaves. In his household in 1850 were Virginia-born wife, Susanna, 39; and five Missouri-born children ages 17, 11, 8, 4, and 1. A 19th century County history described Farris as "a gentleman by birth and education, and...a man of superior intelligence ... [who] was a Jeffersonian Democrat and ardently supported the principles of Democracy." (1) His untimely death in 1853 left his widow to support the family as a milliner and dressmaker. Susanna was listed in Augusta in the 1860 agricultural census owning livestock valued at \$35 which included one milch cow, two cattle and three swine; she still owned Block 4 in the early 1880s.

Farris' house exhibits characteristics of a grafting of Anglo - and German - American building traditions frequently found in Augusta. The symmetrically ordered five-bay facade indicates a desire for a formal elevation typical of the Anglo-American Georgian heritage; the front entry with side- and transom-lights (now boarded over) and pedimented porch are further allusions to classical style. Missouri German features include the half-timbered method of

construction; exposed hewn timber ceiling in the east front room; and saddlebag plan. The large stone central chimney, accomodating four hearths (2 downstairs and 2 upstairs) is a feature associated in Missouri with both Upland South Anglo-American and German traditions, and may be the result of local German builders who constructed the house and/or Farris' own preference. Only one other stone chimney with hearths was identified in the comprehensive survey of Augusta: the gable-end fireplace in the ca. 1836 Leonard Harold log house.

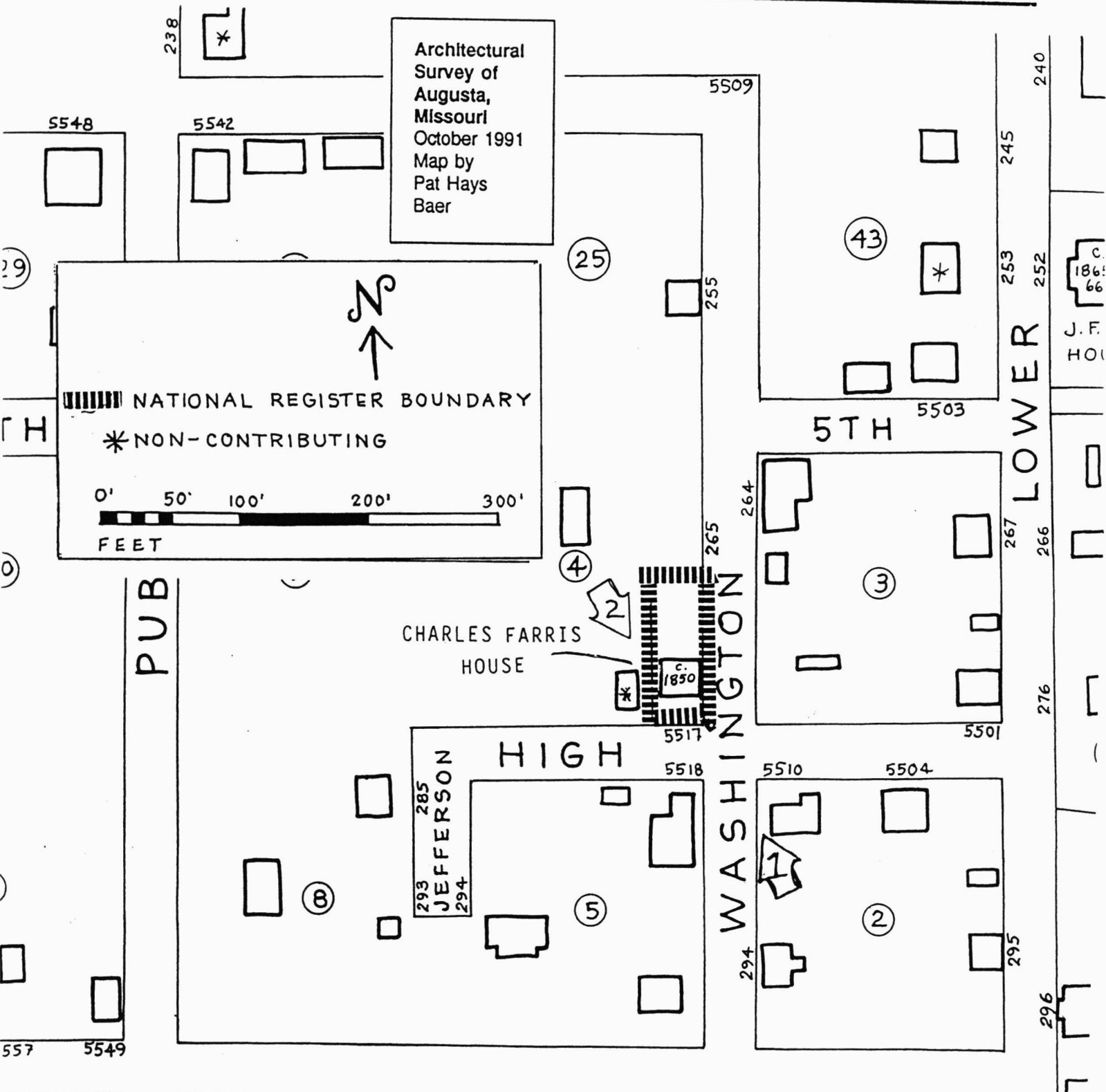
