## First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton

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Graduating with high honors in 1969, she moved on to Yale Law School in Connecticut, where she served on the Board of Editors of the *Yale Review of Law and Social Action* and also worked in the community for Yale Legal Services. At Yale, she developed her special concern for protecting the best interests of children and their families.

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With her husband's election as Governor in 1978, Hillary continued her work on behalf of children. She founded the Arkansas Advocates for Children and Families. She chaired the Arkansas Education

Standards Committee, which, in 1984, created public school accreditation standards that have since become a model for national reform. Hillary introduced a pioneering program that trained parents to work with their children in pre-school preparedness and literacy through Arkansas' Home Instruction Program for Pre-School Youth (HIPPY). She also served on the board of the Arkansas Children's Hospital, where she helped establish the state's first neo-natal unit.

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
