PRESIDENT ADDRESSES THE PEOPLE OF CONNECTICUT AT AIRPORT RALLY

Upon his arrival at Sikorsky Memorial Airport Landing Zone, the President will address the people of Connecticut on the critical choice Americans will face in the upcoming elections: whether to move the country forward on a course of accomplishment or whether to return to the failed, trickle-down economic policies of the past.

Expected to attend the rally are: Representative Rosa DeLauro (D-CT), Representative Barbara Kennelly (D-CT), State Attorney General Richard Blumenthal, State Attorney Treasurer Joe Suggs, Bridgeport Mayor and Lieutenant Governor Nominee Joseph Ganim, Secretary of State Nominee Miles Rapoport, Comptroller Nominee Nancy Wyman, State Party Chair Ed Marcus, State Senator Richard Balducci, State Senator John Larson, and State AFL-CIO President John Olsen.

Rep. DeLauro will make welcoming remarks and introduce Rep. Kennelly, who

will speak and introduce Bridgeport Mayor Joseph Ganim. Mayor Ganim will speak and introduce the First Lady, who will speak and introduce the President.

PRESIDENT CLINTON ADDRESSES FUNDRAISING RECEPTION FOR GUBERNATORIAL CANDIDATE BILL CURRY

President Clinton will address a fundraising luncheon in support of Bill Curry, candidate for Governor. The First Lady will speak first and introduce

Bill Curry, who will speak and introduce the President for his remarks.

Bill Curry faces Republican John Rowland for the seat held by retiring Governor Lowell Weicker, an Independent. Curry has served as state Comptroller since 1990, and previously served two terms in the state Senate.

The major issue in the Connecticut Governor's race is taxes and the economy. As a Congressman (Connecticut's 5th Congressional district, 1984 - 90), Rowland supported supply-side economics. Now, he is proposing wiping out the state's income tax - which will only lead to massive increases in local taxes, specifically the property tax.

Curry has proposed a smarter, pro-business \$1 billion across the board cut in the state property tax - a tax cut that would put more money into the pockets of average working people and jump-start businesses in Connecticut by cutting the overhead on job-creating small businesses.

William E. Curry, Jr. was born in Hartford, Connecticut on December 17, 1951. He is a 1974 graduate of Georgetown University and a 1977 graduate of the University of Connecticut Law School.

PRESIDENT CLINTON ATTENDS RECEPTION FOR HUGH RODHAM FOR SENATE

The President and First Lady will attend a reception for U.S. Senate candidate Hugh Rodham in terminal 10 of the Port of Miami. The First Lady will make opening remarks and introduce her brother, Hugh Rodham. Hugh Rodham will then make remarks and introduce the President for remarks.

Hugh Rodham is a Dade County Assistant Public Defender running against Republican incumbent Senator Connie Mack. While serving in the public defender's office, Rodham worked to establish a Drug Court in cooperation with then-State Attorney Janet Reno. He has made crime his number one issue in the election.

Hugh Rodham, 44, grew up in Illinois and graduated from Penn State University in 1972. A former Peace Corps volunteer, Rodham moved to Florida in 1980 after earning a Masters Degree in Education (1975) and law degree (1980) at the University of Arkansas.

Also attending the reception will be Hugh Rodham's wife, Maria Arias Rodham, Tony Rodham and Nicole Boxer Rodham.

PRESIDENT CLINTON ATTENDS RECEPTION FOR DEMOCRATIC SENATORIAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE

Following the event for Hugh Rodham, the President will attend a dinner saluting Senator Bob Graham, chair of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee.

The funds raised at the dinner will benefit Senate candidates through the DSCC. The event will be held at the residence of Hugh Westbrook of Miami.

Expected to attend are Senator Bob Graham of Florida, Chair of the DSCC; Senator Thomas Daschle of South Dakota; Representative Alcee Hastings of Florida; Representative Carrie Meek of Florida; Senatorial candidate Hugh Rodham and Representative Robert Torricelli of New Jersey.

Senator Graham will speak and introduce the First Lady, who will speak and introduce the President for his remarks.

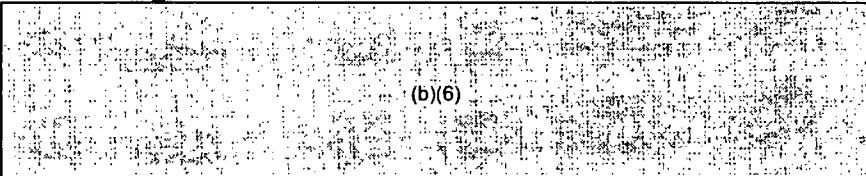

INTERVIEW OF THE PRESIDENT BY DAN RATHER FOR "SIXTY
MINUTES"

The Oval Office

Q Mr. President, again, happy birthday.

THE PRESIDENT: Thank you very much.

Q How are you feeling crossing 50?

THE PRESIDENT: Grateful, good. I just finished a wonderful family vacation. Hillary and I were marveling about how fast the years have gone and how proud we were of our daughter and how fortunate we've been, so I feel very good.

Q Well, let's talk politics. You're 50, Bob Dole is 73; is he too old to be President?

THE PRESIDENT: I don't think that age should determine it. I think a man who is 73 in good health can do the job. You'd maybe have to make some modifications, maybe not do it exactly the way I've done it. But the main thing is whether the ideas are old or new, and I think that my ideas for the future are better and that's the thing I want to fight the election on. The age issue, to me, is not a big thing. That's something that voters, of course, will make their own minds up about; but to me it's not a big issue.

Q Some of your staff members -- not by name -- have been saying, yes, the President thinks Bob Dole is a nice person and has been a pretty good leader in some ways. But, say they, he's been captured by the extremists in the Republican party, the radical part of the Republican party, including Newt Gingrich. Is that what you think?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I don't know about "captured" or not. I believe that this would be a very different country if he had been President the last four years, and would be a very different country depending on which one of us becomes President for the next four. And I just believe he's been wrong.

I think our economic plan was right and all the Republicans -- including Senator Dole, that said it wouldn't bring the deficit down, it wouldn't create jobs -- were wrong. I think we were right to pass the Crime Bill and put the 100,000 police on the street and ban the assault weapons ban -- he led the fight against that. I think we were right to pass the Family and Medical Leave law, it's helped 12 million American families -- he led the fight against that. And we have very different views about the future.

So I don't want this campaign to fought out on insults. I want it to be fought out on ideas, on the record, on the results, **BOTTOM EVEN MORE** on the future. That's what I think we ought to fight it out on.

Q That's what you'd like to have it fought out on. You said you didn't see the Republican Convention. Here's some of the things that they were saying about you.

THE PRESIDENT: (Laughter.) I can hardly wait.

Q Senator Dole said -- and I quote -- "It is demeaning to the nation that within the Clinton administration a core of the elite who never grew up, never did anything real, never sacrificed, never suffered and never learned should have the power to fund, with your earnings, their dubious and self

-serving schemes."

Your reaction?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, first of all, let's look at -- I suppose he's talking about the White House and the fact that we have a lot of young people who work here. Most of them work very hard and do a very, very good job. They really have made a contribution to us.

But in this White House staff we also have Leon Panetta, a seasoned former member of Congress, son of an Italian immigrant walnut farmer, a man who I think would generally be conceived to be one of the most successful Chiefs of Staff in the last several decades. We've had Bob Rubin, who made a great career on Wall Street, on the staff, now the Secretary of Treasury. We have General Barry McCaffrey, hero of the Gulf War, our commander in the southern part of the globe, now leading our fight against drugs.

So I think we've had a very well balanced staff, and I think -- you know, I don't feel the need to criticize him or his people in that way. Did we get results or not? We do have 10 million more jobs. We do have 1.3 million fewer people on welfare. We do have a declining crime rate for four years in a row. We're putting these 100,000 police on the street. We have kept 60,000 felons, fugitives and stalkers from getting handguns because of the Brady Bill. Senator Dole led the fight against the Brady Bill, led the fight against the Crime Bill, led the fight against the Family and Medical Leave law.

Now, I think these young people who believed in the approach that I took were right and he was wrong. And I think the American people are better off because I was here and the people who were working with me were here and he wasn't. That's what I believe.

Q As you know, there are other views, also at the convention. Kay Bailey Hutchison, Senator from Texas, this is what she said, "Candidate Clinton promised a balanced budget. Congress passed it; President Clinton vetoed it. Candidate Clinton promised a middle class tax cut. Congress passed it; President Clinton vetoed it. Candidate Clinton promised to restore ethics in government.

President Clinton put a former bar bouncer in charge of confidential FBI files."

THE PRESIDENT: Well, let's go through that. Senator Hutchison, I like her, but she didn't have one of her better nights, apparently -- I didn't see it. But what I heard about it made me glad I was on vacation. Let's just talk about that.

First of all, I presented a balanced budget plan. We can have a balanced budget today, but Congress wanted a plan that had cuts that were way too big in education, in the environment, in Medicaid and Medicare, that were unnecessary to balance the budget. But they were part of the extreme ideology that they hid at the convention -- apparently they didn't talk about their record -- and I thought it was wrong, and most Americans agreed with me.

In addition to that, the congressional budget I vetoed sought to raise taxes on the hardest pressed working families. They were actually going to raise taxes on the lowest income working people in this country in their budget. So I vetoed their balanced budget because it was the wrong one, but I gave them a balanced budget plan and we had more than enough savings agreed upon.

On the middle class tax cut, let me just make two comments about that. First of all, look what our record is. We did pass a tax cut that is worth about \$1,000 now to a family of four, up to \$28,000. Now, that's not the whole middle class, but we made a good down payment on the middle class tax cut. We made 90 percent of the small businesses eligible for tax cuts, and we gave tax cuts to people who had invested in new businesses and small businesses.

Then, almost two years ago, I proposed my version of a tax cut, which was give people help to go to college, a \$10,000 a year deduction for the cost of tuition -- we've now added to that a \$1,500 credit for the first two years of going to college, so everybody in America can go to community college; let people have a deduction for the cost of child rearing and child care, \$500 credit a year; let people be able to save more money through IRAs and then withdraw from it without penalty for education, first time home buying or health care.

Those are my middle class tax cuts, they've been out there for two years. Now, Congress did not want to agree with me on a balanced budget. I hope we can get agreement even this year. But if we can't get an agreement, then it'll be a top priority next year. So that's the deficit and the budget. Now, if you look at where we've come on the government ethics issue -- we have passed a tough lobby reform bill, that I worked for three years to get, that

everybody recognizes is really a great advance. We have restricted the ability of members of this administration to lobby for foreign governments when they leave, and for other foreign interests. We have had very, very tough ethics provisions in many other areas.

So I can't answer all of their charges but, again, I would say, I hope that this election will be fought out on the record; the differences in our decisions over the last four years, because the American people know; and the differences in our ideas going forward. And that's what I'm going to try to focus on at our convention. I want it to be focused not on the Democrats or the Republicans, but on the American people as citizens and where we're going together.

Q If we have time I want to come back to the convention and how you plan to do yours differently. You said your hope is that it can be fought out on the issues. But one more thing from the convention I'll give you a chance to respond to. As you must know, whether you watched the convention or not, the Republicans fired a number of shots at the First Lady. Some samples: Former President George Bush, he said, "Mrs. Bush upheld the honor of the White House and she did it with class and style and caring and love."

I don't know of anybody in the convention hall who didn't take that as a shot at the difference between the present First Lady and the former First Lady.

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I believe that everyone who knows my wife believes she has class, style, caring and love. If you read this wonderful book that she wrote, "It Takes A Village," that became a number one best seller for many weeks, it's really a chronicle of her whole adult life's work.

Now, she was a different sort of person than many first ladies have been. She had had a career, she had established a national reputation as a child advocate. She had tried to find a way to juggle being a mother, as well as being a wife and being a public person and having a private law practice. And she had never been subject to any of this sort of criticism, to speak of, until she became my partner in this great endeavor.

And, you know, a lot of folks have been working on her for four or five years now and I think she's held up rather well. I'm very proud of her. And I think when history looks back at her and the impact she had on women and young girls, particularly in this country, and all around the world -- that incredible speech she gave on all our behalfs at the Beijing Conference on Women. The things that young women say to me when I go around the country, who are just starting their lives out; the things that women my age and older say to me about Hillary -- I feel very good about that.

And, yes, she's been a controversial character, and when she tried to deal with the health care issue I guess it made her more of a target, as well. But, you know --

Q Don't you get mad, Mr. President, when this sort of thing happens?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I try not to because I don't think it serves any real purpose. All I can tell you is that if you asked me what I was most grateful for at the age of 50, it would not be being President. I'd be most grateful for the years I've had with Hillary and the years I've had with Chelsea. And I know her better than anybody does and I'm real proud of her.

Q Let's talk about taxes. You know what the Republicans say. They're saying it almost every hour on the hour

-you can't trust Bill Clinton; if he gets a second term, he is going to raise your taxes. Are you prepared here and now to say you won't raise taxes in a second term?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I'm prepared here and now to say I'll do what I did in '92, I'll try to do everything I say that I'm going to do in this campaign. And I have absolutely no intention of raising taxes. I have a plan that will balance the budget and provide a tax cut.

What they're really trying to do is to make people overlook what they did. Senator Dole has voted for a lot more taxes than I ever did. Mr. Gingrich once called Senator Dole the "tax collector for the welfare state." And so now he's had a change of heart and he's going back to this old theory that you can cut taxes and you don't have to find a way to pay for it.

Now, I am for a tax cut, but it's targeted to middle class, it's targeted to education and to child rearing. In just this week I'm going to sign the minimum wage bill, which has even more tax relief for small business in it -- tax relief I have strongly supported from the beginning. We can cut taxes. But what they want to do is to blow a hole in the deficit a mile wide. They're going to blow a \$400 or \$500 billion hole in the deficit by promising this big increase -- tax cut, excuse me, with no way to pay for it.

And what I want the American people to remember is what it was like before. When I took office we had a \$290 billion annual deficit, we had quadrupled the debt of this country in four years, interest rates were high. Now what's going to happen to ordinary people is, if they pass this tax cut and they let the deficit go up, interest rates will go up; everybody's car payment, home payment, credit card payments, will go up; and the economy will go down and we'll have fewer jobs. If they do try to pay for their tax cut they'll have even bigger cuts in Medicare, Medicaid, education, the environment, technology, research, the things we need to grow the economy and go forward together than in the bills that I vetoed.

So that's really -- all this is smoke and mirrors. They

don't have any evidence of any great lust for taxes on my part.

Q But are you willing to pledge you won't raise taxes?

THE PRESIDENT: I'm willing to pledge right now that I have no intention of raising taxes; I know of no reason why we would have a tax increase. And I have never been a person who believed in just general tax increases. Even when I was governor, if we ever raised taxes it was for a specific purpose that had overwhelming public support.

And as President, when we put that '93 plan in -- let's go back and look at that. The income tax increase was on the top 1.3 percent of the American people. Almost 99 percent of the American people had no income tax increases. We did everything we could to minimize the tax burden on ordinary citizens. And, as I said, we gave a big income tax cut to families making \$28,000 a year or less. The percentage of people's income today in America, on average, going to the federal taxes is less than it was when I became President.

So I have no record as a big taxer. Senator Dole has voted for a lot more taxes than I have. He's just looking for this -- this 15 percent cut here, I don't know how I'm going to pay for it, he says -- is playing havoc with America's future. I do not have any intention of promoting a tax increase. But Senator Dole once said -- he said something that I admired when he was in New Hampshire once, that a President could never know what emergencies might confront the country. So I don't want to wind up here with some sort of huge national emergency where 90 percent of the people are saying, Mr. President, you have to do something which might require us to raise some money, and me say, oh, well, I promised not to do anything ever.

But I can tell you I have no plans to raise taxes. My plan is to enact my tax cut; to balance the budget; to grow the economy; to leave enough money left to invest in education, the environment, technology, research; and to protect the fundamental obligations we have through Medicare and Medicaid, and grow this country together into the 21st century.

Q The 15 percent tax cut is the heart of their strategy to win. But it is very closely welded to one of their other major themes, which is -- and this is basically the way they put it -- "It's his character, stupid." Now, given whatever the details are, whatever the facts turn out to be -- Filegate, Travelgate, Whitewater -- and the fact that in every poll I've seen most Americans, including those who like what you've done, say they have some doubts, they think maybe that you're covering something up.

Now, given all that, why wouldn't it be better to start fresh with a new president? That's one of their themes.

THE PRESIDENT: Because they'd be going back. They're not going forward. It would not be right for several reasons.

Number one, we're better off than we were four years ago. My economic program has worked. My crime fighting strategy has worked. We are stronger and more respected in the world. We have fewer people on welfare. This country is in better shape than it was four years ago because we have implemented the ideas that I ran on in 1992 -- to create more opportunity, to demand more responsibility, to grow together as an American community. We are better off.

And because Senator Dole fought virtually every major initiative of my first four years -- he led the fight against the good things I tried to do. So I believe he was wrong and I was right. And as you go forward, look at what will happen. Look at the consequences to the American people. He is committed to stopping our program to put 100,000 police on the street. He will abolish the AmeriCorps program. He will cut back on, not increase, aid to education, as I will. He will dramatically weaken our ability to protect the environment. And now he wants to blow a big hole in the deficit that we have taken from \$290 billion a year down to \$116 billion a year on the way to a balanced budget. So if you look to the future, the American people will be worse off.

Now, I don't believe, frankly, that the Republicans could do anything to damage my character -- they may be able to attack my reputation, but God is the ultimate judge of people's character, and he knows all facts and nobody can twist the news and there's no angle there. The Republicans, from the moment I began running, saw that I was a different sort of Democrat, had a different philosophy, wanted to break out of this debate, and they have been working very hard on me and on Hillary and on anybody else they could work on. They practice the politics of destruction, they like that and they're good at it and it makes good print.

But after all the smoke is cleared here, they still have no evidence that I have ever done anything wrong. Now, however, I leave that to the American people to decide. They can make up their own minds about that. All I know is I get up here every day and I try to do what's right to build a better future for this country. And that's what I want this election to be about.

Do they deserve a President that has good character? You bet they do, and they'll be able to judge it. We've been making these judgments for over 200 years. But in the last several years we've gotten way too far off, I think, into just personal destruction. And when I receive reports about the Republican Convention -- I told our people, I said, I do not want any snide remarks made about any of those people; I don't want any sort of negative personal asides; I don't want anybody saying, well, why haven't you worked on them the way you've worked on us. I don't want to hear that. I want this to be about ideas, not insults; about the records of the two candidates, about the positions of the two candidates and about the future. I have nothing bad to say about Bob

Dole's character, and I think that they have not served themselves or America well by this relentless partisan effort they've made for all these years to go after me or the First Lady and others. I don't think that serves the country well and I don't want us to do it.

Q Let's talk about some ideas. You mentioned ideas, wanted the election to be about ideas. Another of the Republican themes is, he takes what we propose and makes out like it's his own.

THE PRESIDENT: Give me an example.

Q Well, welfare would be an example.

THE PRESIDENT: Okay, let's take welfare.

Q But, if you're going to preside -- and this is their point -- if you're going to preside like a Republican, why not have a Republican president, a real Republican?

THE PRESIDENT: That's a great -- let's just take welfare. Okay. They act like welfare is their issue because they introduced a bill that they called welfare reform. And they said, now, that's our issue and no Democrats need apply.

Now, here are the facts. Number one, I was working on welfare reform before they knew it was an issue. I started back in 1980, as a governor. When I was governor of Arkansas we reduced the welfare rolls, even in a tough economy, and I ran on welfare reform.

When I became President I used the power of the existing federal law to cut the states loose from federal red tape to perform experiments -- which my predecessors did not use -- and we reduced the welfare rolls by 1.3 million before the Republicans ever passed a bill -- 1.3 million. That was my welfare reform record and my passion. I presented a welfare reform bill to Congress in '94, which was not passed.

Now, their welfare reform bill did not meet my standards. I wanted to be tough on work -- moving people from welfare to work -- but good to the children. I vetoed two separate welfare reform bills. They finally made some changes that I thought were good -- they added child care, they stopped trying to take the protections of the school lunch program and the protections of food stamps for children and the protection of aid to disabled children -- all these things they tried to take away in their welfare bill.

Q But, Mr. President, even --

THE PRESIDENT: Now, wait. They all tried to take that away. So and then they put it back in, I said, okay, I'll sign it. I still don't think it's perfect -- it's a bad bill in ways that have nothing to do with welfare reform. They took some things out of -- benefits available to legal, law

-abiding immigrants, which I thought were wrong. And they did some things to the nutrition programs that affect low

-income working people I thought were wrong, but I think I can fix them.

Now, here's there question: This is our issue, why don't you give us the chance, sir. I'll tell you why. Go back and look at what they want to do under the guise of welfare reform. They want to cut aid to disabled kids. They want to remove the nutrition guarantees. They want to weaken the school lunch program. Who do you trust to implement welfare reform? This is the beginning of welfare reform, not the end. Do you trust someone who had ideas and worked with states to reduce the welfare rolls by 1.3 million? Or do you trust Mr. Dole and Mr. Gingrich, who tried under the guise of welfare reform to rip the heart of our protection program for the children of America? I think the fact that the welfare work is still to be done argues for Bill Clinton's reelection.

Q But this doesn't address the point that you've taken many of their issues, made them your own. Why not have a real Republican --

THE PRESIDENT: What issue have I taken? They claim they own fiscal responsibility? I balanced 12 budgets as governor.

Q They do claim they own that --

THE PRESIDENT: They claim they own that, but they quadrupled the deficit. They say, oh, the deficit only went up -- they quadrupled the debt of the country 12 years. They said, oh, yes, we had the White House, but the Democrats had the Congress. That's not true. In the first six years of those 12 years, they had the White House and the Senate. They had two

-thirds of the Congress, and they got enough Democrats to go along with them. And they quadrupled the debt of America. It was a myth that they were fiscally responsible.

I said I'm going to be fiscally responsible and we're going to cut this deficit in half. They all opposed me. But we cut the deficit by more than half, got interest rates down. We have \$10 million more jobs. We have 4.4 million new homeowners. We have 10 million Americans that have refinanced their homes at lower interest rates. We have record numbers of new small businesses. We have record exports. Their issue is not deficit reduction or balanced budget. I've got a record on that. They have a rhetoric on that.

Q Every state race I've seen in recent years where it was tax cutting versus the deficit, tax cutting wins -- New Jersey and Michigan being two good examples. Now, Bob Dole says you and those around you here at the White House are "scared" -- that's his

word -- because this tax cut is very appealing and is taking hold.

THE PRESIDENT: Well, let me say this. That's why he did it. I mean, he basically -- he spent, Bob Dole spent, years and years voting for tax increases to make up for the tax cut they adopted in '81 and voted for tax increases even before that. He was here for a long time, more than three decades, voting for tax increases. And he criticized roundly the policies that created the deficits. So he said, okay, I will abandon my public record of decades and decades, and I'll do this because here are these two races where, for governor, where the tax cuts always win.

But, again, I say, as I've said so many times, this sets up a false choice. This is a bogus characterization of reality. It's not tax cuts against no tax cuts. I've got a tax cut. Let's give people \$1,500 a year to go to college for two years. Let's give them a \$10,000 tax deduction to go to pay for all the college tuition. Let's give them a \$500 a child tax credit for child care. Let's give them an IRA that they can withdraw from for education or home

-buying or medical expenses. Let's have these incentives to invest in our inner cities, like I had with the empowerment zone program. Let's help small businesses to have health insurance and to reinvest in their businesses and to grow. But let's don't blow a hole a mile wide in the deficit. I'm not against tax cuts, but I just think we ought to pay for them. We tried once before having tax cuts we didn't know we could pay for. And what did we have? In 12 years we quadrupled the debt of a 220 year old country.

Q You're talking about the Reagan and Bush years.

THE PRESIDENT: In 12 years we quadrupled the debt. We had a \$290 billion deficit when I took office. It's now going to be \$116 billion this year. That's why interest rates are lower. That's why we have record numbers of new businesses. That's why we got 10 million jobs. I am not against a tax cut. I'm against a tax cut that's indiscriminate and not paid for, that risks the health of the American economy and asks people, in effect, to ignore their own lessons and their own common sense. It's not tax cuts that are bad, it's tax cuts that are too big you can't pay for that are bad.

It's just like if you and I went to the bakery -- I used to -- around the corner from my house in Little Rock, from the Governor's Mansion, there was this wonderful old place, a community bakery. And I used to go down there in the morning sometimes, and I'd buy a bagel -- sometimes we'd buy bagels or these little twists or the apple fruit tarts or the cookies -- and it all looked good. And you say, I'll have the cookies and the fruit twists and the raspberry donut and the apple tart and the bagel. And you take it all, and then if you go eat it all at once you'd get sick, even though it's all good.

And that's kind of what -- how I see this proposal. I

am for the right kind of tax cut. It's a part of our strategy to help the American people make the most of their own lives, build strong families, strong communities and a strong nation. But if we do too much, if it's too big, that's not a step into the future; that's a step into the past. And we've still got to invest in education and the environment and technology and these health programs, to grow our country and come together. So that's my position. It's different. I have a different view. It's not tax cut versus no tax cut. That's yesterday's debate. Tomorrow's debate is, what kind of tax cut can we afford, balance the budget, grow the economy and help people make the most of their own lives.

Q Now, the only poll that's been made public so far this weekend shows you dropping like a stone. When you make that argument, don't you find yourself saying, or do you, I think that big tax cut is really endangering my reelection chances?

THE PRESIDENT: No. And if it does -- if that's what the American people want, they should vote for Bob Dole. In this room, this Oval Office -- I'll never forget when I sat with Senator Dole and Speaker Gingrich and they told me what kind of budget they were going to send up here. I noticed they didn't talk about it much in the convention, they didn't talk about their record at all the last two years. But they told me, you know, this was going to be their budget, and the tax cut was going to be this high, and we were going to have -- you know, we're going to remove the guarantee of Medicaid for pregnant women and poor children and people with disabilities and the seniors in the nursing homes; and we were going to create a two

-tier class in Medicare; we were going to gut environmental protection; we were going to cut back on education aid -- we need more education than ever before. And we were going to have everything just they way they wanted it. And I just told them, I said, well, if you want that budget, one of you is going to have get over behind that desk.

Q Well, they're trying to do that, as you well --

THE PRESIDENT: Right behind it. That's what they're trying to do. That's what you have elections about.

Let me just say this. If they don't expand the -- I do want the American people to know this. If they have a plan that does not expand the deficit, then their cuts in education, the environment, Medicare and Medicaid have to be much deeper than the ones that I vetoed. So they're going to have to make a choice. And elections are about choices. But, shoot, you know, maybe the American people want that. And if they do, then they can vote for Senator Dole. That's why you have an election.

I have to stand on what I believe. I have fought hard here for a different approach. When I came here, I said, we've got to break out of what was killing us in the '80s and '90s, this sort

of, you know, left, right, liberal, conservative, tax cut, no tax cut. We need a set of modern policies that break these molds and take us into the 21st century. And if the American people will say, look at the progress that's been made in the last four years; look at the President's ideas for the next four years, compared with Senator Dole's, which is trying to take us back and do something we tried before -- I believe they'll vote for me. But if they don't want to, that is their decision. and it's their country. We're just servants. We just work here.

Q Mr. President, I hear the clock running in my head, and I hear the helicopter beginning to whirl, to take you to your big birthday party. Let me try to get your answers to some questions, regardless of trying to connect them, if you will.

THE PRESIDENT: Okay.

On Whitewater, I know it makes you mad -- you may not want to admit it -- I know it makes you mad. I'm told you don't even watch the evening news anymore because you got so sick of that and some other things. Now we have in the papers this man, James McDougal. He's helping the special prosecutor. Are you worried about that? Is he a truth

-teller? Tell me how you feel about it.

THE PRESIDENT: First of all, I'm absolutely not worried because I never did anything wrong. But I've cooperated, and I'll continue to. And all the evidence so far has supported that. So I'm just not worried. I'm just going to let it happen. I think everybody ought to cooperate. That's what I've tried to do.

Q There were these stories not too long ago that Mrs. Clinton was talking about possibly adopting another child. Now, you're 50, time to get a little philosophical. Is that a possibility?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, you know, we believe very strongly in adoption. And, again, I would say in this minimum wage bill, one of the things that's in there that I love -- a tax cut, is a \$5,000 tax credit for adoptions, to encourage people to adopt. That would reduce the number of abortions. It would reduce the number of children growing up, in effect, in single

-parent households or without parental supervision. And, you know, Chelsea will be out of the nest here pretty soon.

So I have some interest in it, but it's -- I'm sure you can appreciate for us it would be a deeply personal decision. I don't know exactly how it got out. Hillary had mentioned it several times over the last few years that we've talked about it, but we haven't made a final decision. It is something that I would certainly consider. I love having kids around. I've got two young

nephews now. My brother and my brother

-in

-law, Tony Rodham, both have young boys. And one of them was just here running about the White House this morning before you came in.

Q So is it fair to say it's a possibility?

THE PRESIDENT: It's a possibility, but we have not made a -- it's a deeply personal decision, and we'd have to think about our obligation here.

Q Mr. President, plane crashes -- it's very much on my mind, as I know it's on yours, because you had this terrible thing happen in Wyoming.

THE PRESIDENT: Oh, it's awful.

Q One of the White House's planes went down. But we've had ValuJet, the TWA explosion, Ron Brown's aircraft going down. Just last week, the pieces of two different airplanes fell in New York neighborhoods. Do we or don't we need something bold, something new to reassure the flying public on both civilian and military aircraft?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I think, first of all, let's look at -- there are two separate issues here. If planes are at risk from attack, from hijacking or bombs or things like that, we definitely need to and we are stepping up our security. We are checking more luggage. We are checking more passengers -- as you know, we've delayed the flying public quite a bit to increase security. And the Vice President is head of a group that has a very short time frame that's going to come back and make some other recommendations to me on security.

Now, separate from that is the question of, as a result of the ValuJet crash or -- we don't know what happened last night at this terrible thing in Wyoming where these fine people who work for me crashed. There is a question of, is there a problem with the safety of the planes or the training of those who fly them. I would just say to you that we have to make sure that we are -- with military aircraft, now -- two of those three crashes you mentioned were military aircraft -- we have to make sure that we're maintaining those craft as well as possible. You know from the Air Force report what caused the Ron Brown plane crash. And there were a series of errors made there and it's been fully reported.

I'm just concerned that we make sure that we always have the safest possible practices. I think we learned some things out of the ValuJet air crash, which apparently was caused by a cargo error and not by the plane itself.

Now, let me step back and say, we are looking at both those issues. But let me ask the American people to look at this the way I try to. I've looked at the patterns over the last 10 to 15 years, and I have come to two conclusions. Number one, unfortunately, these crashes often come in spurts. So if you look at the crashes, they go up and down and up and down. There's no sort of steady line of increasing accidents, thank goodness. Number two, it's still the safest way to travel over long distances. But, number three, we have an obligation to do more, so we have the Vice President's commission looking at safety and security. And I can assure you that we're continuing to review, to make sure we've done everything we can to make sure that the planes themselves are ready to fly and that there no problems.

But the American people should also know, as I've often said, the people who serve in our military and who serve in the government are at some risk all the time because of the inherent dangers of their flights. And, unfortunately, we do lose some people every year.

Q Mr. President, on international affairs, quickly, are you or are you not going to pull all U.S. troops out of Bosnia on the timetable you set originally, which would be before the election?

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I said I thought when we went there the mission would take about a year. As far as I know, we're still on target for that. The next big goal, of course, is to have the elections there in September.

Q If you pull those troops out, they're going to murder one another --

THE PRESIDENT: Well, let's wait and see. If we have the elections in September -- the Secretary of State just got back from Sarajevo. He had a great trip there. People were coming up thanking him, thanking me and, most important, thanking the American people for bringing peace back there. They've opened the Sarajevo airport again. Dick Sklar, our envoy there, is doing a great job getting businesses started again. We've got to hold these elections.

But, again, I would say to you, we do not need to become an occupying army there, either. The people there are going to have to learn to live in peace and to work together. So I think we're still on the same timetable. And I wouldn't draw a conclusion that the thing will disintegrate until we see what happens in the elections. They're going to have these elections in September. We've got to keep going there. But I believe if the -- if we're going to expect the American people to support our leadership and try to bring peace and trying to move into places and help them, there have to be limits on all these commitments. We can't -- we can't become an occupying army. So based on what I know now, I believe we're still on the same timetable.

Q I want to tap into your being a little philosophical about being 50. Bob Dole and his people say that the words to be associated with him and his campaign are sacrifice, trust, honor, responsibility. Tell me what you think the words should be associated with you in this campaign.

THE PRESIDENT: Well, I believe the words that should be associated with me are opportunity, responsibility, concern for all Americans. And I believe the people can trust me based on what they've seen me do.

I noticed there was a story by one of the news syndicates last week that said that I had either achieved or tried to achieve 80 percent of the things that I set out to do in my -- including virtually all the important ones in 1992. The American people have seen me work. They know I work hard. They know that they can trust me to look out for their interests and to be thinking about them, not just special interests. And they know that I can create opportunity, that I can enforce the responsibility and that I care about everybody in this country, that I want us to go forward together. I don't like seeing politics dividing the American people against each other. And I don't like the politics of personal destruction. I want this to be about ideas and values. And I want this campaign to be about the American people, not about the politicians.

Q Mr. President, happy birthday.
